WRITTEN ASSIGNMENT: DEBATE BETWEEN TONY BLAIR AND CHRISTOPHER HITCHENS ON "IS RELIGION A FORCE FOR GOOD IN THE WORLD?"*

Read chapter 14 in *Religion Matters*, "Do We Need God to Do Good?" and the article "Lunging, Flailing, Mispunching" by Terry Eagleton to prepare for listening to this debate. We will watch it in class on <u>Friday</u>, <u>October 4, 2013</u>. Take notes as you listen.

Write a 3-4 page essay following these guidelines.

- a) Who had the most persuasive argument? (Not who you happen to agree with, but who won the debate?) Explain why.
- b) Identify one important idea that you learned while listening to this debate.
- c) Why do you believe that this idea is important?
- d) Identify and explain at least one point made in chapter 14 or in the article by Eagleton that challenged one of the debaters (or vice-versa).
- e) What questions(s) has this debate raised for you? What are you wondering about?

General format: This paper is due **Friday, October 11, 2013, in class**. Please type and double-space, using standard margins. Check for grammar, punctuation, correct word usage, spelling, and typos. I downgrade for writing errors. No late papers accepted. No email papers accepted. This assignment is worth *25 points*.
